In the Senate Caucus Room, Main Capitol Building, Harrisburg

MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Philip J. Raudensky, president.

Minutes of the previous annual meeting, the 32nd, held November 14, 1960, were approved as submitted.

The report of the treasurer was presented, and indicated that the ending balance for the season would be about the same as the beginning balance, so that the Chapter would operate during the 1962 season on its current revenues.

Fifteen new members were accepted. Seven were officials approved this year and eight were transfers from other chapters. The seven new officials were:

Lester Reichert reported for the Banquet Committee. Other members of the committee are: Morton F. Hulse, Jack Murray, Paul Pugh and Severino Stefanon. The Banquet for the year was to be held at the Bethlehem Steel Management Club.

The Secretary reported that the advance from the treasury for a contribution of 50¢ per member to the Dr. Frank P. Maguire Memorial Fund has been repaid in full.

The Secretary reported briefly on assignments during the 1961 season: the Chapter worked complete varsity schedules for twelve schools, with 38 members participating in 222 assignments. Thirty members had four or more assignments, indicating that the assignments are distributed fairly evenly across the Chapter. In addition to these assignments, more than 400 junior varsity and junior high assignments were made and about 100 midget games were handled.

The Secretary reported that, as instructed by the Chapter, a letter had been sent to every chapter of officials in District III, advising each chapter that the Central Pennsylvania Chapter had nominated W. Reed Ernst for the post of Officials Representative and asking the chapters to support Reed's candidacy. On motion by Paul Marinak and Roy Lutz, it was agreed to make every effort to have Reed elected. Letters are to be prepared for distribution to each official in District III, urging support of Reed.

The Chapter also acted on a series of resolutions. All of the following were approved and except those that are internal Chapter matters, will be forwarded to Ray Y. Grube, Officials Representative.

- I. That Rule 1, Section 3, Article 4 be amended to read, in part, "This may be a scoreboard electric clock or a stop watch carried by the Field Judge."
- II. That Rule 1, Section 3, Article 4 be amended by adding: "If a scoreboard clock is used and is the official timing device for a game, the clock shall be operated by an Official." *Old by Officials' Council. Board of Control asked that it be first considered by District Committees.*
- III. That Rule 6, Section 2, Article 4 be amended to provide that first touching of a scrimmage kick at rest by a player of the kicking team shall end the down.
- IV. That Rule 1, Section 2, Article 1 be amended to require that the goal line be marked by material of a color other than white.
- V. That a study be made of the yardage-chain and the down-marker to determine what improvements can be made, such as distinguishing between front and back post, change of colors, better down-marker.
- VI. That the Athletic Officials Guide, page 21, (1961 edition) be amended to make short sleeved shirts an optional part of the officials' uniform for football.
- VII. That the Banquet Committee be authorized each year to assess each member for assignments to varsity games received from the Chapter, the assessment to help defray expenses of the Annual Banquet.
- VIII. That the Chapter authorize Executive Board to set up a system of penalties for members who miss assignments, to be presented to Chapter at meeting Sep 10.

On motion by Lee Moyer and Reed Ernst, it was agreed that the Executive Board would meet with representatives of other central Pennsylvania football chapters in the fall of 1962 to discuss officiating procedures and techniques in an attempt to establish standard procedures for all to adopt.
