

Rule 7 Questions

- 1) With the offensive players taking their positions on the line, the Snapper points out blocking assignments, but has not yet touched the ball. Defensive lineman crosses the neutral zone. This is an encroachment foul.
 - a) T

- 2) The offensive linemen take their positions, with the snapper and two linemen to his left, and four linemen to his right (split end covering the tight-end). The snapper makes final adjustment to the ball and all linemen are in a 3-point stance. The tight-end notices he is on the wrong side of the ball, and slowly shifts to the left side of the line and gets set. This is a false start, dead ball foul.

- 3) The offensive team must always have at least five players numbered between 50-79 on their line of scrimmage at the snap, except under certain circumstances when they are in a scrimmage kick formation.

- 9) Tight end shoves off downfield to get open before the pass is thrown. After the pass is thrown, and before the ball is touched, defensive back knocks down the tight end and the pass falls incomplete. The only foul is on the offense for pass interference.

- 10) QB drops back and throws a screen pass, but the offensive tackle, A77, gets in the way, and the ball hits him in the back before falling incomplete. No Penalty.

- 1) Possession of a live ball in the opponent's end zone is always a touchdown.

- 2) Assuming no change of possession, if a live-ball foul occurs on the defense during a down when the offense scores a touchdown, the offense has choices of (1) assessing the penalty on the try, (2) assessing the penalty on the ensuing kick-off; however, the penalty cannot be carried over into over-time.

- 3) An unsportsmanlike penalty foul on the offense, during a down when the offense scores a touchdown, results in nullifying the touchdown.

- 5) If R fouls on a successful field goal, K may take the 3 points, and enforce the penalty from the succeeding spot; however, the penalty cannot be carried over into over-time.

- 6) On a successful try, A/K is flagged for holding. A 10 yard penalty is assessed. A/K may choose to snap the ball from anywhere between the hash marks.
